



School Update from Mr. Elliott (3/31/20):

The last two weeks have been a unique time in history. For the first time ever, area schools have closed, sporting events have been cancelled, and we all have had to shelter in place. As you have heard, the president has extended social distancing guidelines through the end of April. This means we will not be returning to school on April 14th as originally planned. School leadership will continue to monitor state and local health authorities, along with area public schools, in order to determine when it is safe to be together and back on campus.

As we enter the third week of remote learning for our K-8 students, we are starting to figure out our new norm for education. While many schools are just starting out, our teachers and students have been doing great! We will continue with this remote learning model until it is safe to return to school.
